Religion and Global Futures

How is religion transforming worldwide and how is this shaping our shared futures?





The master's programme is open to students with a BA from various disciplines in the humanities or one of the social sciences, such as Cultural and Social Anthropology, Study of Religion, Sociology, Islamic Studies, Political Science, History, Geography or African Studies.



The world is changing dramatically. Against the backdrop of climate change, globalisation, population growth, and urbanisation, religion has an enduring and often growing influence.

Addressing religion and global issues.

What role does religion play in global crises such as human-induced climate change? What could peaceful coexistence look like in globalised and diverse societies? How are religious traditions changing in an entangled world? And how does this shape efforts to imagine and build different social futures?

In the English-taught master's programme *Religion and Global Futures*, which is unique in Europe, you will explore emerging forms of religious life from a global perspective – and particularly in relation to questions of global futures.

A master's degree grounded in innovative research.

The master's programme builds on cutting-edge research in the study of religion and related fields which explores dynamics of diversity and relationality within transforming societies across the world. You will investigate emerging forms of religious life and encounters between different religious movements in various global settings. You will explore how these dynamics are closely interwoven with global realities and relevant to issues of global concern, such as climate change, resource scarcity, social discrimination and inequality, pandemics, international conflict and terrorism, neo-imperialism, poverty, migration, (ethno-)nationalism and social cohesion. The programme's focus on diverse geographical perspectives allows you to engage with outlooks that challenge Global North-centred viewpoints.



In the two Core modules and the Methodology I module, you will become familiar with basic theories, methods, and perspectives from the study of religion and global futures, including post- and decolonial approaches.

A master's degree that broadens your horizons.

Your specialised knowledge of religion, as well as your transferrable academic skills, will qualify you for a variety of industries and professions. For example, you may want to pursue an academic career and work for institutions dedicated to research and higher education. Exciting opportunities are also available in transnational institutions that have a global focus such as international development, diplomacy and international relations, security and intelligence, and journalism and media. Graduates who are familiar with diverse cultural and religious traditions are also highly valuable to institutions and companies that engage with religiously diverse clients and communities, for instance, charities and NGOs, as well as roles in marketing and public relations, HR management, public policy, civil service and public sector, leisure and tourism, and social advocacy and political lobbying. You'll be amazed at the doors this master's degree will open for you.
